Trever's Early Steps Journey from his parents, Tawnya and Dan

I remember February 5, 2015 like it was yesterday. It was the due date of our first child and needless to say he was pretty comfortable in there! I had a very healthy pregnancy with no need for concerns or to rush baby out, so I opted to wait as long as possible for any medical interventions to evict him. Finally, on February 17, nearly two weeks after his due date, we decided to induce labor, and we welcomed our sweet first son, Trever, into the world! The delivery was a dream! I had him naturally, we were able to do skin to skin, delayed cord clamping, and my husband and doula were right by my side encouraging me every moment... I had what most would call an ideal pregnancy, labor, and delivery.

It became evident within those first 24 hours that he was very lethargic. He constantly slept, would barely wake to feed, never did the cluster feeding everyone talked about, and never cried due to hunger. He just had a very relaxed nature about him. At his first doctors appointment we were surprised to find out that he had lost 13% of his body weight, was very hypothermic with a body temperature of 94 degrees, and he was starting to get yellow from jaundice. We instantly went back to the hospital to get fluids in him, his temperature up, and begin blue light therapy right away to get his bilirubin levels under control. To make a long story short, we ended up going back into the hospital two more times after that visit all within the first 6 weeks of his life, due to an UTI, failure to gain adequate weight and failure to thrive. After advocating for him and seeking answers, we discovered he had a tongue tie and lip tie which were restricting him from using his tongue properly to be able to feed as needed. He was essentially burning more calories than he was taking in and he would just get extremely sleepy while eating from how much effort it took. With recommendations from an IBCLC, we drove to Jacksonville where we had Trever's tongue and lip ties revised by a pediatric dental specialist, Dr. Gary Myers. Within a few days Trever began gaining weight like a champ and eventually became our chunky monkey, breastfeeding until he was 21 months old! It was evident early on that Trever was not progressing developmentally like other babies his age. He was always very "floppy" and had trouble holding his head up. At 4 months old, we showed concerns to his pediatrician, Dr. Amy Foland, about how he was still not yet able to roll

over. She suggested we inquire about an

evaluation with Early Steps to see if Trever would qualify for physical therapy to help increase his strength. A few weeks before he turned 6 months old, he began PT with his amazing physical therapist, Jerri Quesenberry. Jerri was very compassionate, patient, and understanding of Trever's needs, and was always looking for new ways to help him overcome his challenges. She really helped educate me on ways I could help him at home throughout the week. As a stay at home mom, Trever was my number one priority!

Shortly before his first birthday, Jerri suggested we look into occupational therapy which led us to the Pearl Nelson Center. Trever received OT with his therapist Kari, and soon we also included speech therapy to help with feeding issues. Trever was sitting unassisted, eating puréed foods, and showing huge improvement with his muscle tone. By this point these were all things I started to think would never happen! Over the next two years Trever continued to show progress! He has never regressed when learning a new skill, though it has always taken him a little longer to accomplish one. Trever just turned 3, which means he officially graduates from Early Steps and transitions into pre-k with the Escambia County School District. He just started school at Escambia Westgate School this week and you can already tell how great the environment is for him!

Early Steps was also great at helping my husband and me understand the progress of transitioning into pre-k and prepared us emotionally, for which we are grateful! At this point Trever has no true diagnosis for his developmental delays, is still not walking independently or verbal, but if it weren't for the wonderful services provided by Early Steps, I have no doubt he wouldn't be as far along as he currently is!

Thank you Early Steps, Jerri, Julie, Kari, and Amy, for showing such love and support for our family!
